Know Your Voter Rights

It is your right to...

- Inspect a sample ballot
- Ask a poll worker for a demonstration of the voting mechanism
- Receive voting assistance at the polls
- Cast a provisional ballot if your status as a qualified voter is in question
- Vote for the candidate of your choice
- **Vote regardless of your criminal history**, so long as you are *not* currently incarcerated for a felony charge and have *not* been put on the "Inactive List"

Pennsylvania's polls are open from 7 AM to 8 PM.
As long as you are in line by 8 PM, you are allowed to vote.

Not sure where your polling place is?
Call the Allegheny County Elections Office at 412-350-4500.

Can't make it to the polls on Tuesday? You can pick up and fill out an absentee ballot at the County Elections Office, Room 601 in the County Office Building on the corner of Forbes Avenue and Ross Street.

If you have voted at your polling place before, you don't need identification.

If this is your first time voting at a polling place, YOU MUST BRING ID:

- One of the following photo IDs:
 - A PA driver's license or an ID card issued by PennDOT
 - Any ID issued by a PA agency
 - Any ID issued by the U.S. Government
 - U.S. Passport
 - U.S. Armed Forces ID
 - Student ID
 - Employee ID
- Or one of the following non-photo IDs:
 - Voter's identification card issued by the voter registration commission
 - Non-photo ID issued by the Commonwealth
 - Non-photo ID issued by the U.S. Government
 - Current utility bill
 - Current bank statement
 - Current paycheck
 - Government check

If you have problems on Election Day, call 877-868-3772. You will be put in contact with local lawyers and volunteers who will help sort out your Election Day problem.
